AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR COUNCIL:

The church council met on Sunday November 12th to discuss the business of the church.

- The treasure's report for October indicated that giving was very good in October. The
 church received additional gifts from several members which helped to make the large
 insurance payment and the building interest payment. Unfortunately, the list of
 outstanding bills continues to grow. Bills will be paid based on priority and late payments
 as directed by the Finance Team.
- Pastor Dan Furman gave a report on his work during the month of October. One item Dan pointed out is that because there is not an office manager he has had to take on many of the duties that the office manager would normally do. The council acknowledged the additional work and offered thanks for his willingness to take on the extra tasks that needed to be completed
- Associate Pastor Jeff Vedders discussed the work he conducted during October. He
 highlighted the White Privilege discussion he has been leading and the "Going Deeper"
 opportunities after the service on several Sundays.
- Gregg Hampshire supplied a report on his first few weeks on the job as youth director. He has been meeting with approximately 6 youth on the 1st and 3rd Sundays to focus on service work including writing letters to homebound members.
- The council discussed how we present our inclusive message to the community. The
 conversation will continue at the annual meeting with additional information provided to
 the congregation.

The next council meeting will be on Sunday December 10th following the service.

140 YEARS OF HISTORY! MUSIC

Music has always been an important part of the Church. Early church history indicates the purchase of new hymn books in the 1880's and election of a chorister (Mr. Coleman Cory) in the early 1900's.

A Hammond organ was purchased in 1950. This was replaced with an Allen Electronic Organ in 1982. The current organ (1982 model Allen custom Theatre Organ) was purchased as a used organ in 2000.

New hymnals and choir robes were purchased or given throughout the years. The church building on Van Buren street had a choir loft added as part of building improvements in 1952. The current building had a designated choir area behind the location of the organ.

There have been several choir directors throughout the church life. Among them were LaVern Huyser, William Mumma, and Peg Dygas, Children's choirs have also performed at various times under the direction of dedicated volunteers. Special concerts have been presented. The Christmas Cantata "A Song Unending" was presented in 1997; Joel Gary presented an "Organ Meditation" in 2003 and a "Christmas Pops" concert in 2005. The Praise Band was started in 2005 with Veronica Leshan as director.
